What is CoPS?

- The Council of Pediatric Subspecialties was formed in September 2006 to address the need for communication of common issues to and from subspecialty medicine.

What have we done?

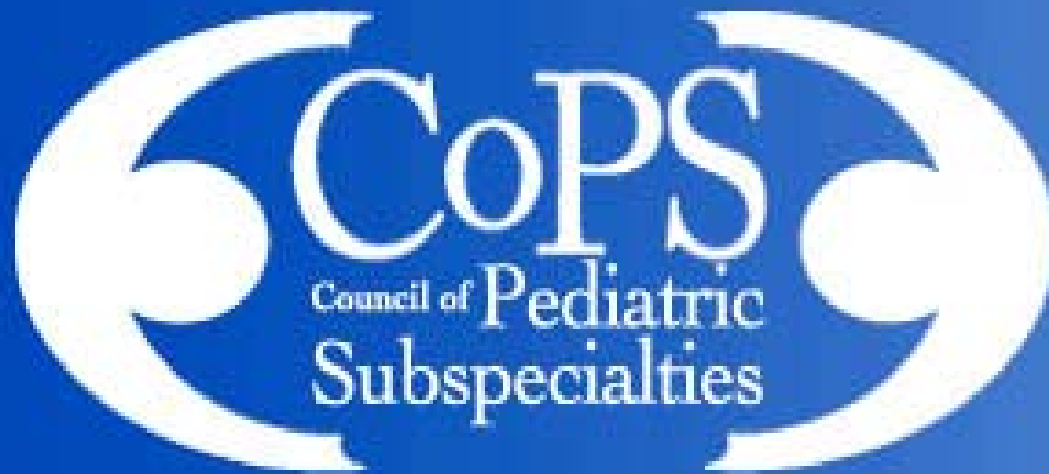
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- Other things along the way.....

- Dr. Norwood assumed the Chair position and Dr. James Bale was elected vice-chair.

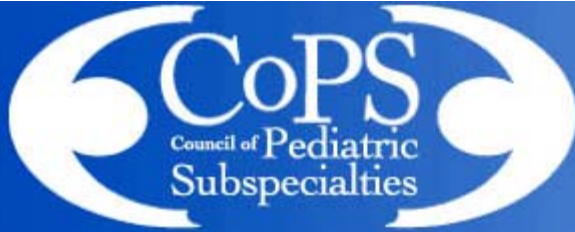

†Dates for Neurology programs start for 2008 season; Neurology did not participate in the 2006 match, but is listed here for comparison to all other programs - will use ERAS until May 31, then written application for later applicants.

Recommendations:

- Utilize ERAS: 12 mos or 18 mos cycle
 - Uniformity within subspecialty
 - No change for subspecialties in ERAS
- Utilize two match periods:
 - Continues what subspecialties already doing
 - Late spring and late fall
- Encourage subspecialties not able/willing to use ERAS or a match date to endorse a common offer date.
- Long term desire that the process becomes even more streamlined.

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PIF Revisions

- In two separate groups, CoPS served as the communication vector from ACGME to subspecialties requesting suggestions for revisions for PIFs.

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APPD “Share Warehouse”

- Accepted APPD invitation to add subspecialty arm to their plans for a curriculum/training practices warehouse.
- Supported request for funding of the project.
- Participating in the development phase of the infrastructure to enable subspecialty inclusion (need a volunteer!).

New requests

- FOPO/APPD: Address the problems of the transition time between residency and fellowship: moving dates, insurance coverage, professionalism.
- ABP: Assist with development of an online program directors' guide for rules/regs/FAQs.
- Join with AAP and an expert working group addressing subspecialty workforce needs and provision of medical homes for children with special health care needs.

So what next?

- Continue work and follow-up of current task forces.
- Operationalize interactions with the ABP, ACGME, and federal agencies
 - ABP PDs guidebook
- “Pipeline” group to address issues of recruitment, retention, funding, and other workforce needs.
- Advocacy group to operationalize subspecialty pediatrics into national health and medical research issues.
- Communications group to expand and better define our communication needs and methods to accomplish that communication.
- Develop a finance committee/task force
